Declaration

I, _____

- (a) Advise that the whole of the above property has been treated for declared plants; and
- (b) That (if a condition of approval) marker posts, of suitable dimensions and painted white, have been positioned at all major boundary deviations of proposed blocks.

The following points should be borne in mind by landowners:

- All properties will be inspected to determine the presence or otherwise of plants declared under the *Land Protection (Pest and Stock Route Management) Act 2002*.
- Treatment by chemical means or physical removal is at the owner's choice so long as it is visibly effective.
- Whilst any necessary treatment of the property remains the responsibility of the owner, Council may be called upon to assist in advising on suitable treatment.
- The positioning of white painted marker posts on the proposed blocks is an aid to identification at a later date. Whilst it is NOT required to fence these blocks, it would be an advantage if these posts were of sufficient durability for them to be used as strainer posts for later fencing if needed.
