Cr Donna Neilson presented the following report:-

A block of land in Old Maryborough Road, which was originally purchased by Gympie City Council for a water reservoir site, will be offered for sale as it has been deemed to be superfluous to requirements. The site currently contains a communications tower previously leased to Queensland Police, and expressions of interest will be called for its removal prior to the sale of land.

Letters of thanks were received from the Senior Citizens' Management Committee for their annual operational grant, the Tin Can Bay Chamber of Commerce and Tourism Inc for the contribution of \$3000 towards staging of the Seafood Festival and the Make-a-Wish Foundation for money raised by Council staff.

A request for funding for an Australia Day breakfast in Kilkivan has been referred to the Australia Day committee for consideration.

The focus on staff training during August was on upskilling of works staff in the area of traffic control. As a cost-saving initiative, sufficient staff have now been trained to enable the majority of traffic control to be provided in-house.

An Equal Employment Opportunity Management Plan was adopted, as well as a Media Protocol Policy. While the Mayor is Council's official media spokesperson, Councillors are able to make statements and respond to media enquiries.

SECTION 8: REPORT BY THE WORKS & SERVICES COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN

Cr Larry Friske presented the following Report:-

At the Works & Services Committee Meeting this month Council considered a wide range of issues.

- O Council has directed staff to proceed with design and construction within the next five (5) years of the Cave Street Kilkivan bridge replacement, Gympie-Woolooga Road bitumen sealing and Brooweena-Woolooga Road bitumen sealing as funding permits. Funding is to be from Queensland Rail Network through the closure of the Theebine-Kingaroy branch line MOU.
- Council has completed the bitumen widening and intersection upgrading on Tin Can Bay Road – works which were carried out on behalf of the Department of Main Roads. This work will make the Rainbow Beach turnoff on Tin Can Bay Road safer for motorists.
- Council has extended to all staff, its congratulations on the excellent work in bringing the Federally funded parks projects in on time and on budget. This was achieved through the cooperation of all Divisions within Council. Thanks were extended to the Parks Manager Mr Ed French for his tireless efforts in ensuring these projects were achieved on time and on budget. Councillors also congratulated the John Street depot staff for their assistance in realising the completion of these works.
- O The Department of Environment and Resource Management has released a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) Stock Route Network Management Bill 2009 outlining the likely impacts from proposed regulatory changes to stock route management, particularly a revised fee structure. Council has resolved to forward an objection to the proposed Bill to DERM and to request the Local Government Association of Queensland to act promptly on behalf of Councils as in its proposed form the legislation is unworkable for Gympie and many other Queensland Councils.
- o Work is proceeding steadily with the upgrade of the Kilkivan Water Supply.
- o Council has modified the current permanent water restrictions to allow the use of hand held hoses with trigger nozzles (ie turn off when not held) for garden watering between the hours of 8.00am and 4.00pm. All other water restrictions will remain in force until further notice.

o Council has approved a \$3M upgrade for the Gympie Water Treatment Plant. The upgrade will improve plant performance.

Research on Compactor Required for Waste Management Facilities

Cr Larry Friske advised that he, together with staff had visited Maryborough and Bundaberg facilities to undertake research in relation to operations and compactors. Extensive research will be necessary prior to awarding tenders for the compactor.

Community Futures Task Force Meeting

Cr A.J. Perrett reported that he, Cr Jan Watt and the CEO, Ken Mason attended the Community Futures Task Force Meeting in Brisbane on Monday, 12 October. Cr Perrett advised that significant discussion occurred at the meeting regarding the release of the Co-ordinator General's report re Traveston Crossing Dam. He also advised that the role of the Community Futures Task Force is drawing to a close, given that it has served its purpose in the Mary Valley. It provided an

avenue and opportunity for views to be put forward through these difficult times. The CEO added that Major General Peter Arnison is due to visit Gympie twice this month.

Keeping Australia Working Forum

Cr Donna Neilson reported that she and the Mayor attended the Keeping Australia Working Forum on Monday, 12 October, that the forum was well attended and that Mr Gary Davison was announced as employment coordinator for the southern Wide Bay Region.

Queensland Heritage Council Visit

Cr Donna Neilson reported that members of the Queensland Heritage Council visited Gympie on Friday, 9 October. Members were impressed with rich heritage on display and beauty of the Jacarandas and gardens. They had lunch on Art Gallery Verandah, undertook a walking tour of streets, visited Memorial Park, the AICM building and travelled on the Rattler to Amamoor. Cr Neilson expressed her appreciation to Council for hosting the visit.

Schoolies Week Alternative

Cr Jan Watt read a letter she received from a local student promoting an alternative approach to schoolies week. A group of students is raising funds to visit disadvantaged countries to offer assistance. An art-based fund raising activity will be held on 6 November at the Gympie Regional Gallery. Cr Watt commended the young people involved for undertaking such a venture.

Review of Sport and Recreation Funding

Cr Jan Watt reported that at the recent Sport and Recreation Committee meeting, it was raised that a review of the funding program is being conducted by State Government. The objectives seem to be melding with issues of the Department of Communities. Cr Watt and the Sport and Recreation Committee were concerned that future sport and recreation funding could be linked to Department of Communities guidelines. Workshops are being conducted within the region, but given the short notice, members of local community groups may not be aware of these workshops. Cr Watt requested that dates be confirmed and information be passed onto community groups in conjunction with the Gympie Times.

Friends of the Library AGM

Cr Jan Watt reported that she attended the Friends of Library AGM on 9 September, during which Dr Elaine Brown provided a report on the Local History Section of the Library. Cr Watt commended this Section of the library's operations to Council and staff and congratulated the members involved.

Mental Health Week

Cr Rae Gâté advised that as part of Mental Health Week, Choice Support Services opened its new premises in Lady Mary Terrace on Saturday, 10 October. Cr Gâté extended her congratulations to Choice Support Services for the work undertaken for the benefit their clients.

125th Anniversary Celebrations – Monkland State School

Cr Rae Gâté reported that she represented the Mayor and Gympie Regional Council at the 125th Anniversary Celebrations for Monkland State School on 3 October. Cr Gâté advised that the celebrations were extremely well attended by the members of the community and ex-students some of whom travelled considerable distances to attend.
