Waste Collection Guidelines



Ensure your bin is not overflowing and the lid can close securely.

Put your bin on the kerb before 6am on bin collection day.

Bin collection times vary every week.



Don't overload your bin as it cannot be lifted by the garbage truck arm.

Don't park in front of the bin, and make sure access to your bin is clear.

What goes in the Recycling Bin



Keep these out of your recycling bin



Plastic bags

Bubble wrap

Plastic film

Chip and lolly wrappers

Soft plastics

Batteries

Food waste

Coffee cups

Garden waste

Polystyrene

Soiled paper and cardboard

Waxed cardboard

Receipts (thermal paper)

Tissues, napkins and paper towel

Pyrex, mirrors and ceramics

Broken glass and light bulbs

Plastic plant pots

Gas cylinders

Clothing and textiles

Recycling tips

Use the Australasian Recycling Label (ARL) as a guide.







- Keep it clean: Rinse containers and bottles.
- **Keep it loose:** Don't bag your recycling.
- **Size matters:** Don't recycle anything smaller than the palm of your hand.
- **Remove lids:** If smaller than your palm, place it in waste bin. If larger than your palm, place it in recycling bin.
- Scrunch: Clean and unsoiled aluminium foil can be recycled if it's scrunched into a ball the size of your fist.
- Flatten: Please ensure all cardboard boxes are flattened before going into the recycling bin.

Use the waste hierarchy

AVOID

Try to avoid creating any waste at all.

REDUCE

Choose items with less packaging.

REUSE

Reuse items rather than buying new.

RECYCLE

Follow recycling rules to reduce contamination.

DISPOSE

Use this option as a last choice.

Waste management facilities

Gympie Regional Council's main waste management facility is at Bonnick Road, Gympie. There are waste transfer stations in Goomeri, Gunalda, Kilkivan, Mary Valley, Rainbow Beach, Tin Can Bay and Widgee. Check the council website for opening hours.

Safe Sharps Disposal - Please ensure sharps or needles are correctly stored inside a hazardous waste container. Drop off locations include:

- Any pharmacy participating in the Queensland Needle and Syringe Program.
- The sharps disposal unit located at the entrance to the Gympie Hospital.



Containers for Change - Collect eligible containers for 10c and drop off at refund point or schedule at home collection service. containersforchange.com.au/qld



Battery Drop Off Locations - Aldi, Woolworths, Mitre 10, Bunnings and waste management facilities. Disposing of batteries in your waste or recycling bin is not safe as they are flammable and cause fires in bins or garbage trucks and create a hazard for truck drivers and the community.



Mobile Phone Recycling - Recycle all brands of mobile phones, their chargers and accessories.
