

ASF prevention and early detection eLearning course

What is it?

The **African swine fever (ASF) prevention and early detection course** is a new on-line course designed to help learners understand what they can do to protect our agricultural industries and communities from ASF.

The course uses images, videos and interactive scenario-based activities to provide a detailed and engaging picture of the potential impacts of ASF, how to prevent its introduction and establishment, and how to recognise and report the signs of ASF to ensure early detection if the disease does make through Australia's defences.

The course includes three modules and should take approximately 1½ hours to complete.



Who is it for?

Australia is free from ASF - and everyone can play a part in keeping it that way!

This course is particularly relevant to anyone who owns, interacts with, or observes domestic or feral pigs as part of their work or recreational activities. This includes:

- ✓ people who keep pigs, including commercial operators, small holders and pet pig owners
- ✓ anyone from the pork production, meat processing or animal transport industries
- ✓ vets, vet nurses and students
- ✓ agricultural advisers and service providers
- ✓ feral pig managers, hunters or harvesters
- ✓ landholders and state and local government officers who may observe feral pigs on lands they manage.

How can I access the course?

This free course can be accessed through the Animal Health Australia (AHA) eLearning platform.

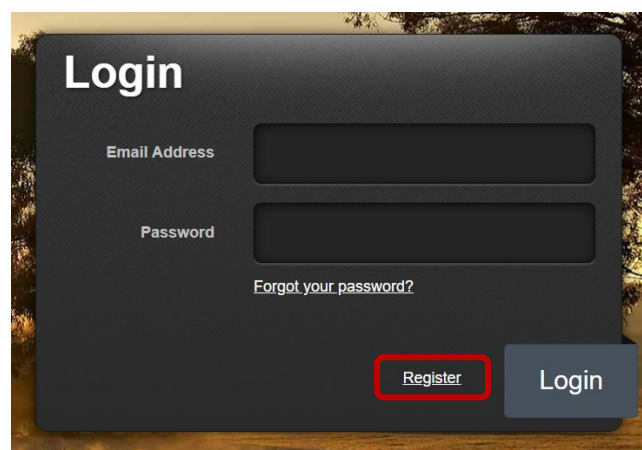

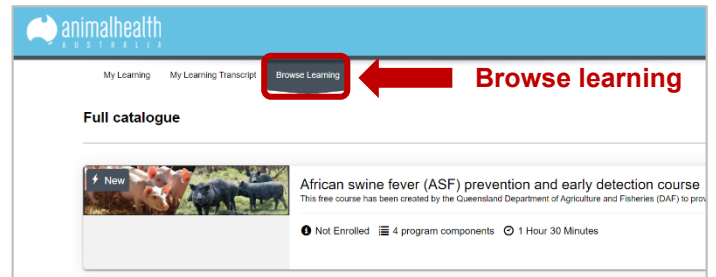


2. If you haven't previously registered with AHA, click on the Register link (shown in red below) to create your account.





3. Once logged-on, click on the Browse Learning tab then click on the course title.
4. You will be taken to the course home screen where you will see the course overview. Click on the Enrol button to enrol in the course.
5. Once enrolled, you will be able to Launch each of the three modules that make up the course.

Overview

This free course has been created by the Queensland Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (DAF) to provide anyone who interacts with domestic or feral pigs with information needed to help protect Australia from the threat of ASF. If you own, work with, interact with or observe domestic or feral pigs as part of your work or recreational activities, you can help protect Australia from the potential impacts of this infectious pig disease. This course consists of 3 modules which provide information about how you can help prevent ASF from entering Australia and infecting our pig populations, and how to recognise and report clinical signs of ASF to promote early detection and reduce the impacts of an outbreak should ASF reach our shores.

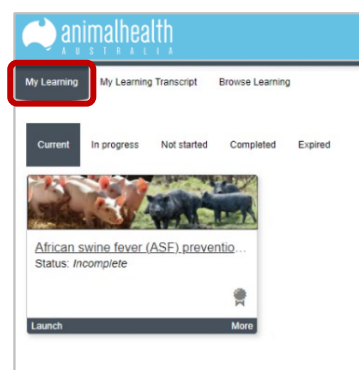
Although developed by Queensland DAF, most of the information is applicable Australia-wide. Throughout the course, links are provided to additional resources and online videos to assist your learning. Australian Veterinary Association (AVA) members may be eligible to claim 1 VetEd continuing professional development (CPD) point by completing the course.

The course works best when you:

- Open it in Google Chrome, Microsoft Edge or Firefox. Some functionality may be lost if you use other internet browsers.
- Use a device with a larger sized screen, such as a desktop computer, laptop or iPad. Use of smartphones is possible, but not advised as the size of information and functionality is not ideal.

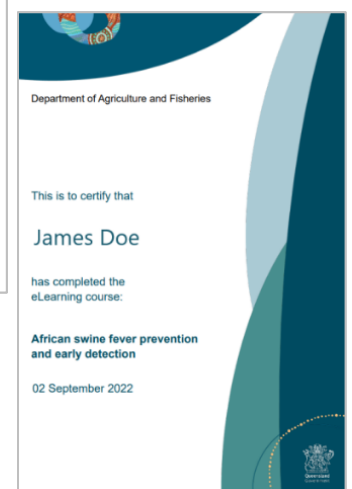
