Gympie Regional Council is pleased to announce the Gympie region has been activated for the Reconstruction of Essential Public Asset (REPA) relief measures available under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA) as a result of;

- Ex-Tropical Cyclone Seth, 29 December 2021 – 10 January 2022
- South East Queensland Rainfall and Flooding, 22 February – 5 April 2022
- Southern Queensland Flooding, 6 – 20 May 2022

Road Works proposed

Where event related damage has occurred, work crews will be undertaking the following REPA work activities on the below roads.

The general work activities include;

- Unsealed Shoulder grading and repairs
- Heavy road formation grading and gravel re-sheeting
- Table drain cleaning and desilting of drainage structures
- Reinstatement of damaged culverts including headwalls
- Reinstatement of damaged or missing road signage and road edge guide posts, and
- Bitumen Pavement repairs and or replacement
